We would like to invite you to attend CRDA's 50th annual Gala on November 5th & 6th, 2010 at the University of Northern Colorado (UNC) in Greeley. The featured cuers will be Michael & Regina Schmidt from Germany and George & Pamela Hurd from Texas. The clinicians will be Karen & Dick Fisher from Texas and Peter & Chama Gomez from Colorado. Your favorite CRDA cuers will also be cuing the evening dances for you!

On Friday afternoon there will be casual, warm-up request rounds from ~2:00 to 4:00 pm. (Since the set-up committees will be in the ballrooms setting up, the starting time is approximate.) Roy Knight and Chris Cantrell will be cueing your requests phases 2 – 6.

Parking at UNC is free on Friday evening and on Saturday day and evening, but is NOT free on Friday afternoon. Parking passes can be purchased at the University Center parking lot dispenser or in the University Conference and Events Scheduling Office on the second level of the University Center for \$5 or you may park for free on the street. Please do not leave your car unattended while purchasing a parking pass, security has been known to issue tickets.

The meeting was called to order at 10:08a.m. by Patrick Krause. Minutes from the last board meeting were read by Justin Stute and approved. Cards were sent to George & Peggy Smith, Jim & Sharon Peyrouse, and Yvette Ogren's son, Jeff.

Treasurer's Report

Treasurer's Report was submitted and reviewed.

President's Report

CRDA received an email with concerns about CRDA representation at the State Festival and USA West this summer. CRDA did advertise both events and even contributed financially to the State Festival. While a higher attendance would be preferable, we can't force dancers to attend conventions. CRDA will continue to promote all opportunities for round dancers to dance.

The board continued their discussion on offering CRDA sponsored clinics before the fun dances. It was decided that since our fabulous CRDA instructors are already offering clinics, boot camps, etc., CRDA does not need to sponsor them at this time. However, those events will be advertised on the website (in a separate non-CRDA sponsored event location) and can be sent to the email reflector list to all CRDA members. CRDA and non-CRDA events can be advertised on the same flyer or email as long as it is clear which events are CRDA sponsored.

To make end-of year transitions easier, a new email address is going to be created for the president of CRDA and the webmaster. Then the contact information will stay the same even when there is a change of personnel.

Vice President's Report

The Vice Presidents found 3 fantastic candidates for the board to be voted on at the Annual General Meeting at the Gala in November.

The process of finding new board members is very tricky and time consuming. Many dancers either do not have time to join the board or are not interested. The board discussed the possibility of changing either the bylaws or supplementary rules related to the distribution and definition of people on the board. Currently only 3 instructors can be part of the board. Do we want to consider allowing more instructors positions on the board? Also, what is the definition of an instructor? Currently the bylaws use the same definition for a cuer, instructor, and teacher. Are they the same thing? The board will continue this discussion at the January board meeting.

Spring Dance

A lot of research has been done related to finding new venues (that have a 5000 sq. ft. dance floor) for both the Spring Dance and the Fall Harvest, since rental prices of our current venues are going up.

After much discussion, it was decided to book the Avalon Ballroom in Boulder for the Spring Dance at \$50/hour on May 22nd. If it can't be secured, the dance will move to the Arvada Methodist Church on April 10th for \$250. Either way, the spring dance will take place from 2:00-4:30pm; the hall secured from 1:30-5:00 for set-up/clean-up time.

Harvest Moon

This year's Harvest Moon cost \$500 and brought in \$488. 49 lines on the sign-in sheet were used, with 3 of those being singles.

The El Jebel Shrine's rental rate is increasing to \$480 this year. In addition, they might open the restaurant at the Shrine called The Oasis that day, even though it's not typically open on Sunday. If enough dancers make reservations at The Oasis the day

of the dance, they will lower the cost of the hall. Look for more information on this in future flyers.

The board decided contact the El Jebel Shrine about booking the hall for the Harvest Moon Dance on September 25, 2011, in addition to opening The Oasis. Due to the rental rate increase, the board approved a price increase of \$2 for the dance. The price changes are as follows:




