Presidents Letter - Rob & Terri Sherwood

Since your last Round Notes, two CRDA Fun Dances have enjoyed great attendance of around 20 couples for each event. February had John & Karen and Chris & Rose cueing at the Maple Grove Grange, and March had Mitchell and Dave & Tracy taking turns at the microphone at the Wheatridge Grange. It is hard to imagine what Round Dancing would be like in Colorado without the availability of Colorado Granges, which rent out their buildings to our dance organizations at very reasonable prices. If you have ever priced Ballroom classes at commercial facilities, you know we have a bargain we should all appreciate.

Our annual Spring Dance is again scheduled at the wonderful Avalon Ballroom in Boulder, Sunday April 19th between 2:00 and 4:30 PM. Spring should really be budding out by then, and memories of snow shovels will have been forgotten. We now have contracts with the Avalon for both this dance and Harvest moon filed away in the completed folder.

Of much less certainty is the venue for our Gala in November. Your board, and other CRDA members, have been struggling with issues over the Colorado Mesa University contract. A contingent from CRDA visited the campus on February 17th with no clear resolution as to the viability of holding the event in Grand Junction. Not only is the availability of rooms a problem, but even the contracted price is now in dispute. Fortunately, our guest clinicians for the Gala have not yet purchased plane tickets, and they will be holding off until all this is finalized. Your Presidents visited a very nice recreational center in Windsor in March, which holds possibilities, but with ballroom size and some scheduling issues. Our Gala chairs Patrick and Eileen Krause are still trying to negotiate with CSU in Ft. Collins, which doesn't open their contract calendar until April 1st. The same April or May timetable for booking events exists with CU Boulder, which also has ballroom facilities.

What we do know is our Spring and Fall dances are cast in stone, and we will need volunteers to help out. Small but important jobs like taking money at the door, organizing refreshments and cleanup after the dance are always important. Becky & Dave Evans, and Janet & Steve Pitts are your contacts for the Spring dance, and Peter & Chama Gomez are handling point for Harvest Moon in September.

If you haven't visited our web site lately, you may be surprised at the abundance of information and dance events it promotes. For instance, you can access the CSSDA (Colorado State Square Dance Association) calendar, which not only includes information on square dance clubs, but round dance clubs and classes, too.



ROUND DANCE TIP

Hover Corfe --- Tim Eum

The "Hover Corte" feels odd because it has a back left face pivoting action and dancers are much more familiar and comfortable pivoting right face. One way to think of Hover Corte is that is like a left turning Spin Turn. In both figures you start in closed position (CP) and the man steps back into a pivot, except that in the Hover Corte the man steps back with his right foot and pivots left face instead of stepping back with his left foot and pivoting right face as in the Spin Turn. The lady steps in as far as the man steps back thus maintaining good frame still in closed position. The pivoting action continues into the second step which begins more like a side step but because of the turning action ends up as a forward step checking with man's left foot (side and back right for the lady). The couple rises during the second step hovering up on toe by the end of the second beat. The couple is still rotating left face slightly at the end of the second beat and turns enough to end in BJO. Drifting down the man steps back (lady forward) on the third and final step completing the Hover Corte.

Mesa University has a beautiful ballroom in the University Center for the Friday and Saturday evening dances that splits into 3 floors. Unfortunately, the University has

"bumped" CRDA from the ballroom on Saturday during the day for a school function. The University staff apologized for their mistake. They showed us several other possibilities for the Saturday daytime clinics and teaches, none of which would work for CRDA. We are looking into other locations in Grand Junction for the Saturday daytime clinics and teaches, and still have the Friday and Saturday evening dances at Mesa University. We are also considering changing venues. Several venues have been ruled out for carpet, cost, size, etc. We still have a couple more venues to check out. 

An Alemana Is not A Twirl

Round dancing has many different moods. Different rhythms, and even different figures within a rhythm, can be playful, romantic, haughty, or demanding. One figure might be quite simple and open, while another is complex and rich in emotional depth—and the Alemana Turn is an emotional figure. There is promise and rejection, pursuit and reconciliation. If we dance it like an Underarm Turn, we lose some of that, and if we do a Twirl, we're singing a different song altogether.

The Twirl might begin in semi-closed position. In Two Step, the man steps forward on his left foot and raises lead hands so she can go under, he closes right to left, and then he steps forward left again, lowering the raised hands. The woman steps

forward right and turns to the right under raised hands. She steps side and back left, again down line, and completes a full turn, and then she steps side right to face. Notice that the man is doing a Forward Two Step down line, and the woman is doing a Roll Three under joined lead hands. The essential character of this figure is loose and playful. He is sort of skipping down the sidewalk, and she is twirling beside him.


The Underarm Turn is a Latin figure. In Rumba, we start in a facing position with the trail feet free. Maybe we've just done a Half Basic. Then the man steps back right, raising lead hands, and she crosses her left foot in front of her right, turning 1/2 to the right. On beat two, the man recovers left, and the woman recovers right, completing the turn to face her partner. On the slow count, both step side on the trail feet. This is a quieter figure. We do not have the progression that we had in the Twirl. Second, the steps are not really together. If we begin facing the wall, his first step is backing toward center, and hers is crossing toward line. We're kind of wandering away from each other.

But there is no "wandering" in an Alemana Turn—every step is focused on our partner. The Alemana is a two-measure figure, so the preparatory, Half-Basic-like measure doesn't need to be cued. We might begin in closed or butterfly position, facing the wall with lead feet free. The man steps forward left (woman back right), recovers, and then closes left to right raising lead hands and turning his upper body a little to the left. The woman takes her lead from this arm and body action, and her third step is side and forward right with just a little right-face swivel. Notice that her third step brings her close to his left side. She might orient her upper body toward him and gaze meaningfully into his eyes.

In the second measure, the actual Alemana Turn, he steps back right and draws her to him. She steps forward left and abruptly turns 1/2 to the right. Notice that she does not cross in front and so step away from him. She steps toward him, teasingly, and *then* turns. During step five, the man recovers left, and the woman steps forward right. She is walking away, but he is pursuing. At the very end of five, she turns sharply 1/2 to the right to face him again, and on step six, both step side together. If you would like to think a little in terms of phase-V actions, the woman's first sharp turn is spiral-like, and her second turn is hip-twist-like.

And this is high drama. During steps three and four, boy meets girl. At the end of four and during the beginning of five, boy loses girl. At the end of five and into step six, boy gets girl again. If you dance the Alemana Turn like an Underarm Turn or like a Twirl, you're dancing a whole different story.
