Presidents' Letter - Rob and Terri Sherwood

We have a potential problem on our hands in respect to a lower number of preregistrations for this year's Gala in Grand Junction compared to last year. We were all spoiled for 20 years with a consistent venue at UNC in Greeley. Before those years, the Gala moved around the state, and hasn't been on the western slope for 25 years or more. As you may know, the great facility at CSU Pueblo won't be available again until at least 2017. UNC at Greeley priced themselves out of the market, and the other Colorado universities won't allow booking an event until May of a given calendar year.

Your board members scoured the state for a location, and Colorado Mesa University was our one and only option. Then, they informed us they had double booked the ballrooms during the daytime, so your Gala chair couple (Patrick and Eileen Krause) went the extra mile to rent two great ballroom studios within a short distance of each other for our morning and afternoon teaches.

Our clinicians are top notch as usual, with Randy and Marie Preskitt and Steve and Lori Harris providing teaching and cuing for the weekend. As always, you can enjoy a full weekend of dancing and instruction at whichever level you choose. There will be figure clinics for the two phase III teaches, two phase IV teaches, and one each V and VI teach.

Remember the cost of putting on the Gala is fixed regardless of how many couples attend. We have a very unique weekend program which caters to every dancer, regardless of the level they dance. This type of program can only continue with the consistent support of our membership.

Colorado cuers Ed and Elvira Glenn and Becky and Dave Evans will be the Phase III Figure Clinic instructors.

The University Center Ballroom on the 2nd floor of the Colorado Mesa University Center (located on 12th St. between Elm Ave. and Kennedy Ave.) will be used for the Friday and Saturday evening dances at 7:00 p.m. There will be request rounds and programmed rounds for your dancing enjoyment. There will NOT be a Friday afternoon warm-up dance. Parking at the University Center is free on Friday and Saturday evenings after 6:00p.m.

On Saturday, The Roper Music Ballroom (136 N. 5th St.) will be the location for the Phase VI teach at 9:00 a.m. and the Phase V teach at 2:00 p.m.

The La Puerta Dance Studio (421 Colorado Ave.) will be the location of the Rhythm and Figure Clinics, and the Phase III and Phase IV teaches:

9:00 a.m.- Morning Phase IV teach (main ballroom) 2:00 p.m. - Afternoon Phase IV teach (main ballroom)

9:00 a.m. - Morning Figure and Rhythm Clinic (separate room) 2:00 p.m. - Afternoon Figure and Rhythm Clinic (separate room)

10:30 a.m. - Morning Phase III teach (main ballroom) 3:30 p.m. - Afternoon Phase III teach (main ballroom)

The La Puerta Dance Studio and The Roper Music Ballroom are close to one another in downtown Grand Junction. Parking is free on weekends in the downtown area. Also, there is a parking lot behind the La Puerta Dance Studio and there is a parking garage across the street from The Roper Music Ballroom.

The Roper Music Ballroom will also be the location of the CRDA Annual Membership Meeting starting at 11:45 a.m.



Floor Craft

Round dancers are usually easy-going and peaceful. But occasionally, a couple can become either thoughtlessly or exuberantly unaware of the effect of their behavior on others. They are focused on their own dancing, a bit blind to those around them, and they can really start scaring the women and children (so to speak). Recently, a couple (out of state, but still . . .) actually ran into a friend of ours and knocked her to the floor. Obviously, this was much more than a matter of etiquette. There could have been serious injury.

Floor craft is the skill to dance among other couples without hitting them or intruding into their personal space. It is the ability to adapt your dance style to that of the floor so everyone feels comfortable and unthreatened. One with good floor craft is like a courteous, defensive driver, as compared to a texting, aggressive driver who tail-gates and then swoops in to cut you off in front.

Here is a top-ten list of ballroom rules to help us be a little less wrapped up in our own thing and a little more aware of other dancers and their feelings and well-being. Not all relate specifically to Round Dancing, but the focus on consideration certainly does.

- 1. Travel in two-lanes counter-clockwise around the floor. This is called the line-of-dance. Avoid frequent lane changes.
- 2. Use the rest of the floor, that is, the inner floor or center floor, for spot patterns, practice and alternative dances (e.g. Swing during Foxtrot, Jive during Quickstep).
- 3. Do not travel through the center.
- 4. Do not travel or step back against the line-of-dance. A couple of back steps by the leader are possible by turning and dancing in the line-of-dance. However, the leader must first check if space and traffic permit this maneuver.
- 5. Keep moving in the line of dance. Do not stop suddenly, practice, or do spot patterns which hold up traffic (other than quick turning patterns which finish in the line-of-dance) in the travel lanes.
- 6. If you feel like doing a spot pattern, move to center-floor, finish the pattern and then move back into the travel lanes (when there is an opening). See spot dancing below for spot pattern or spot dancing floor craft tips.
- 7. Avoid overtaking. Use rocking or other types of hesitation steps (such as Cadencia steps in Tango), and wait patiently for the travel to resume. DO NOT push or elbow your way past the blockage. When someone is stubbornly holding up traffic and overtaking is necessary to help maintain flow, move to the next lane only if there is an opening in that lane's traffic.
- 8. Men must protect the lady against collisions and must never place the lady in a position where she can get hurt by others.
- 9. Do not invade another couple's space. Do not tail-gate. Give other couples enough space to execute normal patterns.
- 10. Do not focus on completing a pattern if a collision can result or if completing a pattern can result in invading someone's space. Learn to adapt patterns to what the traffic permits.

COLORADO ROUND DANCE ASSOCIATION BOARD OF DIRECTORS MEETING

August 15th, 2015

Meeting was called to order by Steve Pitts, Vice President at 1:59 p.m. Board Members present: Harold Sears proxy for Rob and Terri Sherwood, Steve and Janet Pitts (Vice President), David Smith (Secretary), Harold and Cindy Vanhooser as proxy for Treasurer, Jim and Margie Garcia, John and Karen Herr, Patrick and Eileen Krause, Les and Susan Fry as proxy for Fred and Judy Layberger, and Jim and Jane Wamboldt. No other CRDA members were present. Minutes from the April 11th, 2015 Board of Directors meeting were read by Dave Smith and accepted as read.

CRDA Correspondence:

A total of 7 cards were sent since the last meeting in April. Tracy Smith – condolences, Beverly Moore - get well, Jean Montgomery - get well, Bill Starkey - congratulations on retirement, Jim Peyrouse - thinking of you, Art Lowell - get well, Maxine Springer - thinking of you, and Bonnie Bahr - get well

Treasurer's Report:

Steve asked if everyone had a copy of the treasurer's report. Hall deposits for upcoming dances have been made. Some CD's are expiring in October and the BOD should discuss what to do with the proceeds. It is easy to get answers from Chuck if you ask.

Motion: Accept Treasurer's report Margie Garcia first and Karen Herr second Motion passed

President's Report:

Steve presented a report from Rob Sherwood. The next BOD (Pre-gala) meeting will begin 10:00 a.m. on Saturday, October 3rd at Rose Hill Grange. Refreshments will be served at 9:30 a.m.

Vice President's Report:

No Report.

Round Notes:

Karen Herr would like to change the cutoff date for article submission to Round Notes. The cutoff date is the 15th of the month in which it will be published. Karen is asking for the date to be the 1st of the month.

Motion: Change operating procedure for submission of articles to Round Notes to the 1st of the month in which it will be published. Karen Herr first and Jim Garcia second Motion passed.

Karen has a new assistant (MaryKaye Buchtel) helping to produce Round Notes. Karen has been making incremental improvements overall to the presentation of Round Notes. Distribution of printed copies is around 25, everyone else is accepting soft copies.

Cuer Selection Report:

Featured cuers Curt and Tammy Worlock have been confirmed for Gala 2017. Karen and Ed Gloodt are being considered. Steve Pitts asked if the committee could contact Karen Gloodt about it – there were no objections.

Harvest Moon:

Janet Pitts read parts of a report from Peter Gomez. A deposit has been made for the Avalon, and the program will be ready soon for publishing. Peter is promoting more dancing with less talking and eating. Local cuers are encouraged to demonstrate (ask first) and should communicate with Peter to get on the program. Margie volunteered to coordinate refreshments and the BOD members are expected to bring finger food. Eileen

Krause asked if teachers and/or teaches have been selected. Patrick Krause expressed concern about announcements on a loop, and Eileen asked for Gala announcements to be made live, in addition to any other medium. Karen Herr indicated that we need to know the program details now – people are marketing and advertising the dance now. General discussion followed about the dance levels, the participants and the general attendance of the Harvest Moon. Everyone expressed concern about what people should expect if they come and how to market the dance. Steve Pitts suggested that it should contrast with the Spring Dance. Janet will communicate with Peter to get everything finished. Janet asked for Harvest Moon volunteers - Jim and Jane Wamboldt and Dave Smith volunteered.

Gala 2015:

Patrick and Eileen Krause presented some current registration details: 32.5 couples have signed up, 7 couples are enrolled over last year. 25.5 couples signed up at Gala, 2014. The Days Inn Hotel has 70 reserved nonsmoking rooms and 20 of those have been reserved. Margie Garcia told the group when you call to register at the hotel, ask for front desk; otherwise they know nothing. Patrick indicated 5 couples have expressed interest in commuting by bus and unless numbers increase by a bunch, most people may end up carpooling. Featured cuers have been contacted regarding event details and expectations. Volunteers include Jim and Jane Wamboldt (gift bags), Ed Glenn (sound equipment with Steve Pitts, Dave Smith, and David Evans as roadies), and Judy Smith and Sue Dunlap (after-party). Website has been updated thanks to Harold Sears. The gala vote list is live on CRDA website CRDA.net along with carpooling info. It was noted that local cuers who teach can vote for their club members (multiple people). Paper copies of the vote list are printed and will be available at Harvest Moon. Patrick noted that 6 cuers have signed up so far. Discussion regarding cuer operations at the Gala, and the dilemma about splitting the ballroom in two decent size rooms (Phases 234,456), or into 2 smaller and 1 decent size – Phase 23, 34, 56. The general consensus is leaning towards the 2 hall solution. There was more discussion regarding attendance levels from recent years. Due to the current booking issues, there will be no decorations at this event, and two registration areas needed on Saturday. Patrick expressed that Gala 2015 is expected to lose money this year and to consider this for future events and venues.

Gala 2016:

An event chairman is needed soon. Being a board member is not a requirement for this position, so please volunteer. The biggest obstacle is the venue selection right now, so much discussion regarding the pros/cons of various venues including Greeley, and cost of halls in Greeley. Suggestions included choosing Greeley so a chairperson could focus on the event instead of the venue. Comments from the July Fun Dance in Keenesburg (Judy Layberger) were discussed. Patrick will submit ballroom search data for publication in Round Notes. Moving the date and venue for 2017 and beyond was also discussed and it was suggested asking cuers and dancers who attend regional about what is out there. Karen Herr will participate in studying this issue with the clarification that Karen Herr will not be the Gala chair. A ballroom with 10K Square Foot is desirable, but flooring options, costs and locations must all be considered. NESDC has flooring which may be available. Steve will volunteer to look into flooring options. Much more lengthy discussion about costs and options in Greeley compared to other venues. Windsor was noted as a possibility several times. The question: How long can CRDA survive with a loss every year?

Hall Of Fame:

Jim Garcia noted that 5 couples were nominated and all declined.

Fun Dance:

Janet stated that recent fun dances were well attended.

Membership:

Ron Blewitt recently distributed (soft copies) an updated roster recently. Hard copies are available, just ask.

Colorado State Square Dance Association Representative:

Judy Winter, Peter Gomez and Karen Herr recognize changes are needed to illustrate Round Dancing is a part of state square dancing. The name should include Round Dance. There is some opposition but overall the response is positive. CRDA needs to be involved in the state leadership to provide focus on Round Dancing at state sponsored events.

Denver Area Square and Round Dance Council Representative:

No Report.

Promotion/Publicity:

Janet (Judy) always sends out reminders for fun dances. Flyers are available for the Harvest Moon, Fun Dances and national events.

Web Page:

Harold Sears has been updating the web site CRDA.net and Patrick Krause added the voting list for Gala 2015.

Historian:

No report.

Unfinished Business:

Karen Herr has contacted many people and organizations regarding policies on electronic recording at dance events. Karen compiled the results and presented the facts – CRDA is the only organization without a policy. Steve Pitts suggested CRDA consider this and begin making policy soon.

Summary:

No electronic recording of dancers in general.

Electronic recording only allowed for teaching sessions and demos with focus on instructors only – no dancers.

Hand held cameras only – mounted cameras are often left running unattended.

No posting to public sites without permission.

All recordings are for personal use only.

New Business:

Steve Pitts will coordinate with Rob Sherwood the need for an emergency meeting for Gala 2016. It was suggested this happen soon and with a very specific agenda.

Karen Herr asked if the CRDA board would consider sponsoring a Roundalab (RAL) mini-lab, where RAL instruction is presented at a local venue. The RAL mini-lab is a 20 hour event for cuers (teaching and cuing) with dancers welcome to attend. RAL assigns clinicians and pays their travel expenses, and CRDA would be expected pay for their hotels and meals. Karen suggested asking for grant (hall and advertising) money from for 53rd national to offset costs. Topics would cover teaching, cueing, marketing, advertising and business. John Herr indicated RAL provides all of the curriculum. Karen is asking if CRDA would be willing to host such an event. Discussion followed about the benefits of such an event, who would benefit from it, and who would attend. Steve Pitts asked if there were any objections to Karen inquiring about this. Karen noted that RAL needs 270 days advance notice to follow through.

RAL mini-lab discussion summary:

RAL assigns clinician and pays for travel and fees – CRDA pays for everything else.

CRDA organizes everything else, provides the venue etc...collects the money and keeps whatever is left.

Who would benefit and who would attend? Is CRDA willing to sponsor/CRDA subsidize?

Motion: Allow Karen Herr to pursue information regarding RAL for a local minilab – on behalf of CRDA and apply for grant money from 53rd? First Harold Sears and Second Margie Garcia Motion Passed.

Other Business/Announcements:



As you know, CRDA has been looking for suitable venues for holding future CRDA Galas.

In general, we would like to have a room of 7,000 sq. ft. or more with a wood floor for combined dancing and also a way to separate the room (or have other rooms available) for level dancing and instruction.

Many locations have been suggested and have been checked out. Here is a listing of those which have been contacted this past year.

Universities/colleges:

- 1) Colorado Mesa University (CMU) location of 2015 Gala.
- 2) UNC Greeley still requires a \$1000 catering fee per ballroom/per day.
- 3) CSU Pueblo (location of 2014 Gala) not available until 2018.
- 4) CSU Fort Collins Can't request until March of Gala year
- 5) CU Boulder (Glenn Miller Ballroom) Can't request until April of Gala year
- 6) University of Denver (DU) 4,600 sq. ft. wood floor (separates to 2 sections but no longer separates)
- 7) Colorado Western State University 3,375 sq ft carpet. 2 sections (1/3 and 2/3). 10'x20' dance floor for a fee.
- 8) Colorado School of Mines (http://greencenter.mines.edu/GC-Friedhoff-Hall):

Friedhoff Hall – only wood floor ballroom on campus. 5,160 sq. ft. \$500 per hour (minimum 4 hours) Student Center Grand Ballroom (A, B, C) – joined, is smaller and is carpeted.

9) University of Wyoming – Can't request until March/April of Gala year.

 - (1-3,825 sq ft; 2-2,407 sq ft; 3-3,400 sq ft; 4-2,083 sq ft) \$75 \$100/hour for each.
- 10) Chancio's Restaurant (Highland Hills 950 Sheridan): 2,500 sq. ft. carpet, has 225' dance floor for extra \$500
- 11) Stonebrook Manor (Thornton) is a wedding venue, food catering and bar required. 2 floors maybe not sound isolated.
- 12) Arvada Center for Performing Arts Ballrooms are carpet.
- 13) Bennett Event Center (Recreation Center) Gym (\$20 \$40 per hour)
- 14) Keenesburg Middle School floor sticky, sound was OK, possible echo.
- 15) Maple Grove and Wheat Ridge Granges size and availability issues.
- 16) Boulder Senior Rec Center 2720 sq. ft., \$150/hr. other rooms 880 sq. ft. and 960 sq. ft. \$75/hr.
- 17) Ralston Valley High School Gym and cafeteria.
- 18) Budweiser Event Center (?)
- 19) Other high schools and middle schools gym finish issues and scheduling issues (basketball and volleyball)
- 20) Arvada United Methodist Church (?)
- 21) El Jebel Shrine Center sold not available.
- 22) Loveland Outlet Mall meeting rooms (?)

Flooring rental information:

NE square dance council owns plastic flooring which was rented for the state square dance convention. ICBDA rents Russian Birch Floor -33,000 sq. ft. available. \$0.80 - \$1.25 per sq. ft. plus 2 hotel rooms for staff.

We would appreciate help from all CRDA members to be on the lookout for possible future Gala venues in the state. Keep in mind the basic room size requirements for holding a Gala. It would help if you would please do some basic research (internet search, phone call, or visit for sizes, type of floor, rates) before recommending the venue to CRDA.


Maps of the 2015 CRDA Gala Venues in Grand Junction, CO

Below is the map from the host hotel (**Days Inn, 708 Horizon Drive**) to the Colorado Mesa University Center.

The **FRIDAY and SATURDAY EVENING** programs will be held in the ballrooms on the 2nd floor of the University Center, starting at 7:00 p.m.

The University Center is located on 12th Street between Elm and Kennedy Avenues. Enter the parking garage from 12th Street. Parking is free after 6 p.m. on Friday and Saturday evenings.



The SATURDAY MORNING and AFTERNOON teaches and clinics will be held in downtown Grand Junction - (NOT at the CMU University Center).

Below is the map showing the locations of the Roper Music Ballroom and the La Puerta Dance Studio. Parking is free on Saturday on the street and in public parking areas. There is a large public parking garage across from the Roper Music Ballroom and a public parking lot behind the La Puerta Studio.






