I don't remember ever doing that before, and this simple inversion of the figure was surprisingly disconcerting at first. I think most of us like the variation, now -- hope so. Things to Know for the 2023 Gala

Directions to the Occhiato Ballroom

When you arrive at CSU Pueblo University, look for the CRDA Gala signs to help direct you to the Occhiato Ballroom, which in on the east end of the Student Center. There are detailed directions on the CRDA website http://crda.net/documents/OcchiatoBallroomDirections.pdf. Access to CSU-Pueblo from either direction is from Colorado Hwy 47, east of I-25.

From the West -- Exit CO47 at Bonforte Blvd: Cross the bridge and at the University entrance turn right on Bartley Blvd. Follow Bartley Blvd. around the east side of the campus curving twice to head west to the University Student Center exit into the Ballroom parking lot. The Ballroom is on the east end of the Student Center. There will be CRDA GALA signs with arrows on Bartley Blvd to help you locate the Ballroom, plus the University has good directional signs to the University Student center.

From the East – Exit CO47 at Troy Ave: Head north on Troy Ave and turn left onto Alamosa Dr. Follow Alamosa Dr until it intersects Bartley Blvd. Turn right on Bartley Blvd and follow it north and west to the University Student Center exit into the Ballroom parking lot. The Ballroom is on the east end of the Student Center. There will be CRDA GALA signs with arrows on Bartley Blvd to help you locate the Ballroom, plus the University has good directional signs to the University Student center.

Water

CRDA will be handing out bottles of water at the Registration Table again this year. There will be labels so you can put your name on them and refill them at throughout the weekend. The water bottle can be refilled at the water fountains outside the ballroom using the water bottle faucet. Or the dancers could bring their own water bottle and fill it at the water fountain. Water bottles can be taken into the ballroom (with a tight fitting lid) for easy access during the workshops and evening dances.

Food

CSU Pueblo has lunch available on Saturday. The Café will be open for brunch from 10:30am to 1:00 pm. Lunch is \$11.42 per person. There are also many restaurants close by in Pueblo.

Hearing Assist will be available for checkout with different channels listed for each hall. You may bring your own earpiece (3.5 mm male plug) as well. We use the Williams EAR 022 earpiece.

Ow, My Aching Feet! By Sandi Finch

Another big weekend is looming for many of us, with three days of dancing at the Palmquist Palm Springs Round- Up in about 10 days, not to mention the walk along the Street Faire on that Thursday and any sightseeing you work in while not dancing. It's time to re-visit our thoughts on keeping your feet happy and healthy. You certainly don't want to miss anything! It doesn't matter how melodious the music, or how intriguing the choreography, or how well you look in that new dress, if your feet are nagging you to *sit*.

Think about it—your feet are made up of an amazing number parts. One fourth of the body's bones are in the feet—26 in each foot. They are cunningly linked through 33 joints and that web of fascii that runs from your big toe, up and over the heel, along the back of the legs and into the trunk. Such intricate possessions rate consideration, yes? Especially when any one of those joints or ligaments can cause discomfort.

Some exercises are valuable to stretch the Achilles tendon before you begin dancing. Sit with knees together and feet together pointing forward (not turned out). Count 1,2 as you move a foot and 3,4 as you replace it.

- 1. Stretch the right foot forward with only the toes touching the floor, return it to its starting position. Do this 8 times. Repeat with the left foot.
- 2. Stretch the right heel forward with toes pointing up, return to its starting position. Do this 8 times. Repeat with the left foot.
- 3. Lift the right foot with a "pawing" action, replace beside the left foot. Do this 8 times; repeat with the left foot. For ankle flexibility, lift the right foot forward and up, about four inches off the floor. Rotate it in a clockwise circ cle 8 times. Count 1,2,3,4 for each circle. Rotate the foot in a counter-clockwise circle 8 times. Repeat with the left foot. To improve your balance, stand with feet together and arms in dance position with good tone in the frame. Rise slowly onto the balls of both feet, counting as waltz, 1,2,3. Lower the heels slowly with the same count. Do this 8 times. Now try it with the right arm raised to shoulder height and the left arm curved overhead. As you rise slowly onto the balls of the feet, bring both arms overhead and stretched. Lower the heels bringing the left arm down to the side and right arm curved overhead. Do a basic forward waltz with proper rise and fall and arms in good frame, then backward waltz, also with proper rise and fall and timing.

Before you ever get to the dance, make sure your body is primed. *The Healthy Dancer*, published by the American Ballet Theater, says you need sufficient carbohydrates to avoid fatigue, suggesting 55% of your daily calories should come from carbohydrates. Make sure you drink plenty of water to avoid dehydration. *The Healthy Dancer* suggests nine cups of fluids a day for women; 13 cups a day for men. The authors say dancers should check their urine regularly—dark yellow signifies dehydration.

And at the dance, if your feet begin to yelp, do what Bobbie & Jim Childers do. Have a couple of golf balls in your dance bag. Put them in a sock and roll your feet around on them. Look silly? Maybe. But it will feel good.







GENERAL INFORMATION

Since 1961, CRDA has been an unusually active state round dance organization. CRDA sponsors dance events throughout the year, most notably the fall Gala weekend with nationally recognized guest cuers-instructors, an informative bi-monthly newsletter, Round Notes, and our website at www.crda.net. CRDA is primarily a dancer-run organization, staffed by both dancers and instructors who contribute their time, knowledge, and skill. CRDA is managed by a Board of Directors consisting of 9 couples elected from the general membership. Present via Zoom were Larylee Hitchens, Bill Shauck and Luan Jones, Jack and Gayle Baker, and Justin Judd del Sol (general member).

Greetings from Justin: He is back in Colorado and is working hard in physical therapy to be able to walk with a walker. He is at assisted living at the VA. While he was away from Colorado he saw lots of skilled dancing in Ohio and Indiana. He was also able to spend time with his oldest son. Welcome home Justin! We have missed you.

Minutes: (Margie Garcia)

Minutes from May 6th were approved as corrected.

Treasurer's Report: (Melanie Thompson)

A Pre-registration fee for next year's 2024 Gala for a full package a couple would pay \$150 at this year's Gala. After Sat. night the 2024 a couple's full package fee would be \$160 until and thru the Spring Dance. After the Spring dance the couple's full package fee would be \$170. At the door the fee would be \$180. Singles pay half. First time attendees pay \$120. Nonmember couple fees would be \$20 more and nonmember singles would pay \$10 more. These new prices are more than comparable with other weekend festivals in other states fees featuring one couple and one hall. We offer 3 halls and 2 nationally known cuers.

A motion was MSP that 2024 dues paid at this year's Gala will continue to be \$20. and will then increase to \$24 after Oct. 15th. This will be announced at the annual meeting.




